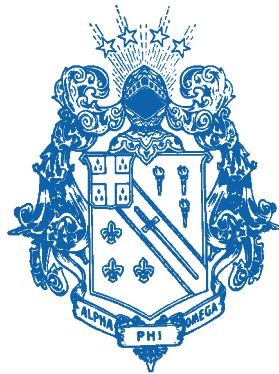

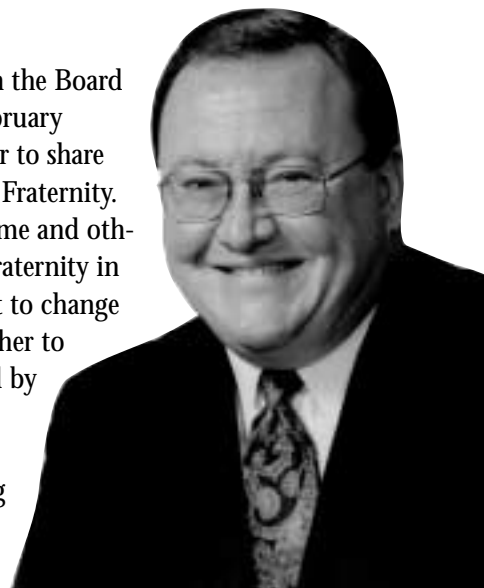


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

ENDOWMENT

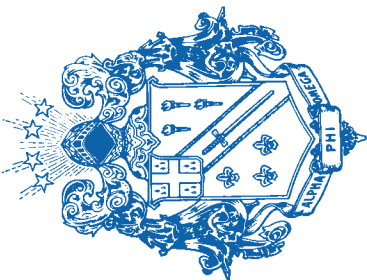
- To provide our Fraternity with an Endowment that will sustain this Fraternity through good times and bad.

Featuring... Dr. David L. Kulhavy

For those of you who have never had the chance to meet Dr. David Kulhavy, we would like to share some of the wonderful traits that help make him so special to Alpha Phi Omega.

Since 1991, Dr. Kulhavy has been a Faculty Advisor for the Nu Sigma Chapter at Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches, Texas. Through his personal motivation, he has inspired many Brothers to carry on the tradition of building their chapter's involvement throughout the four areas of Service.

Dr. Kulhavy has helped the Nu Sigma Chapter strengthen its relationship with the Boy Scouts of America, become more involved in community projects, enhance individual leadership development skills, as well as make a positive difference in unlimited ways. In addition, the Nu Sigma Chapter was named Organization of the Year on campus for 2001-2002 as a result of Dr. Kulhavy's encouragement and instrumental organization of special service projects. With sincere gratitude, Dr. Kulhavy would like to express his "personal recognition to Frank Shockley, David Gano, Kori Parker, and Erin Cunningham for their continued support in serving Nu Sigma."

While working for the College of Forestry at Stephen F. Austin State University, Dr. Kulhavy is well recognized as a dedicated professor. He is a devoted husband and father, staying active in the community, while volunteering and supporting the beautification of Nacogdoches.

Dr. Kulhavy, also known as "Dr. Bug" by thousands of students and teachers across the nation, has developed an educational program to bring entomology to elementary and secondary school classrooms. In 1993, he received the Distinguished Teaching Award in Entomology from the Entomological Society of America and was awarded the regional National Association of Interpretation award for his interpretations of Dr. Dave's Bugs.



Dr. Kulhavy is best known for his lively portrayal of a giant ladybird beetle and was featured in *Discover* magazine as part of Insect Expo '92 in Baltimore, Maryland. Where children are to be educated, Dr. Kulhavy can always be found. His credo of teaching is "Curiosity,

Enthusiasm, and Observation" to instill into students a real desire to learn.

One special memory of Dr. Kulhavy's was receiving the Don Candler Award in 2002, named after a Nu Sigma charter member who was killed in Vietnam. He urges each chapter "to seek recognition for those who have served in the military, especially those who have given their lives."

Other chapter awards graciously presented to Dr. Kulhavy include the Distinguished Service Key, fall of 1998; Faculty Advisor of the Year, 1999; and Pledge Class Namesake, spring of 2000. He was also presented with the very first National Phyllis Churchill Tenney Excellence in Advising Award at the 2002 National Convention.

Dr. Kulhavy stays actively involved in our Fraternity as a strong mentor by participating in meetings, events and ceremonies. He gladly takes the time to listen and give advice, while exemplifying Alpha Phi Omega's Cardinal Principles in everything he does. Offering helpful words of advice to new advisors, Dr. Kulhavy states, "It is important that the chapter recognizes you as an asset - willing to work with the entire group. There are unlimited rewards in Leadership, Friendship and Service."

We feel honored to have Dr. David Kulhavy as one of our Brothers and will continue to appreciate his sincere dedication for many years to come.
