ALPHA PHI OMEGA — 150,000 STRONG

On December 3, 1977, Alpha Phi Omega reached a milestone in its 52 year history with the initiation of Ronald E. DeCamp, the Fraternity's 150,000th member, into Phi Epsilon Chapter at Maine Maritime Academy at Castine, Maine. Brother DeCamp, a native of Linwood, New Jersey is a Freshman majoring in Nautical Science at Maine Maritime and was a part of Phi Epsilon's 12 member Fall, 1977 Pledge class.

Phi Epsilon Chapter was chartered on May 9, 1969 at Maine Maritime Academy, a four-year college whose mission is to train men and women to become officers in the Merchant Marine. Richard E. Mastrangelo, Sectional Chairman, presented the charter in behalf of the Fraternity, and Sigma Xi Chapter from the University of Maine at Orono provided the ritual team. The ceremony was held aboard the Academy's training vessel "State of Maine". Billed in **Torch and Trefoil** that year as the only sea-going chapter of Alpha Phi Omega, Phi Epsilon has taken its service program to foreign as well as state-side ports. In Cartagena, Colombia, the members spent a day doing much-needed mechanical repairs in a childrens' hospital.

The service program of the last year will serve to demonstrate the outstanding manner in which Phi Epsilon is extending the principles of Alpha Phi Omega. Last summer's annual cruise, which took Phi Epsilon to New Orleans, Bermuda and the Bahamas, again found the chapter exporting Alpha Phi Omega to a foreign shore. While in the Bahamas, Chapter President Doug Gilbert and Advisory Chairman Mrs. Phyllis Tenney found the Ramfury Home for Children, a small orphanage which the children left only one weekend a year. The Brothers took thirty children to the ship, where they were given tours, shown movies, and fed tons of ice cream. Unfortunately, the members could spend only one day with the children, but, before they left, presented the Home with a \$200 gift certificate to upgrade its sporting facilities.

The new school year started off with a bang when nearly 100 Freshmen attended the chapter's Labor Day Party, which familiarizes new students with Alpha Phi Omega. In line with chapter tradition, \$200 was donated to the Jerry Lewis Telethon for Muscular Dystrophy that weekend. In the fall, Phi Epsilon sponsored two blood drives, raising over two hundred pints of blood from the Midshipmen, tops in their county.

Football weekends at the Academy found the chapter selling tickets for the games, handling housing for alumni for Homecoming, and selling Grab Bags on Parents Day. The funds raised were donated to charity and to a fund for Midshipmen activities.

During the Fall, the chapter hosted the first Daisey Day Birthday Party to honor the founder of the Girl Scouts of America. With help from Gamma Sigma Sigma Chapters at the University of Maine at Orono and the University of Maine at Machias, the chapter hosted six hundred and sixty Girl Scouts for the weekend event. A Halloween Party on October 31 brought seventy grade school children onto the campus for the chapter-sponsored event. At Christmas, the chapter conducted a Toy Drive for Pineland Hospital throughout Castine, and the Townspeople and Midshipmen donated their unused toys for the handicapped children.

The biggest event of the year for Phi Epsilon is the annual Boy Scout Klondike Derby. This event has been featured in **Scouting** magazine and is the highlight of the winter for Maine Scouts. The chapter has been forced to limit the weekend event to 550 Scouts, since the Scouts live on the ship, eat on the mess deck, and have use of the Academy facilities. On Saturday afternoon the big race, with troop-built sledges, is held on the Castine Golf Course.

As Phi Epsilon approaches its 10th Anniversary, the 184 members and advisors initiated since its founding can be very proud of the record of accomplishments under the banner of Alpha Phi Omega.

As we approach the end of the 1977-78 academic year, it seems appropriate to reflect upon what we have accomplished since last Fall...and indeed we can be proud of our achievements.

The National Board of Directors, with volunteer support from across the nation, has been hard at work developing long range plans for some twenty areas of the Fraternity. The Long Range Planning Commission will finalize its recommendations on the future of the Fraternity at the July Board Meeting. These will be shared with the membership in the fall.

The dedicated efforts of our volunteers have resulted in two reactivations and two new chapters this year, and there is the promise of several more new groups joining us before the year is completed. Pledging is up by 21% over last year and chapters have reported 10% more initiates than in 1976-77. As a result of the increased membership, chapters have been able to render more service to their campuses and communities.

The potentially divisive issue of full membership for women, enacted by the 1976 National Convention, has been accepted in the spirit of fellowship, and no chapters have withdrawn from the Fraternity, as was initially feared. Today 40% of the active chapters have women as full members of Alpha Phi Omega.

The efforts to obtain an exemption from Title IX of the Higher Education Act continue and substantial information has been supplied to the Department of Health, Education and Welfare in support of Alpha Phi Omega's request for an exemption. On March 22, 1978 Representative John N. Erlenborn of Illinois introduced legislation to exempt service fraternities and service sororities from the provisions of Title IX. This bill, HR 11724, has been referred to the House Subcommittee on Postsecondary Education, and chapters and members have been urged to contact their Congressmen to support the exemption effort.

The 1977 Development Campaign was the most successful to date, and those members providing exemplary support are listed on Page 4 and 5 of this issue of **Torch and Trefoil**. It has been tremendously rewarding to experience the generosity of our alumni in supporting the program of Alpha Phi Omega.

The professional staff of the Fraternity will be expanded when a Director of Membership Services, who will coordinate the Fraternity's expansion program and provide support to weak chapters, joins the Kansas City Staff on September 1, 1978. Applications for the position are currently being accepted in the National Office.

In December, we will gather at the Opryland Hotel in Nashville, Tennessee for what could prove to be the Fraternity's most successful National Convention. All members and alumni are invited to be present.

It is a joyous experience to be able to focus on the future and the promise of things to come, especially in view of the difficult times which we so recently experienced. Each of us can be proud of our contribution to the spread of Leadership, Friendship and Service through Alpha Phi Omega.

The following actions were taken by the Board

- Authorized the employment of a Director of Membership Services and the upgrading of a part-time clerical position to full time for September 1, 1978. (Applications are currently being accepted at the National Office.)
 - Stated that all proposals for the official 1978 National Convention program be referred to the Convention Planning Committee and that the program be subject to Board approval.
 - Adopted a format on membership goal-setting which involves input from chapters, sections and regions, and which expresses a challenge in goal attainment.
 - Recommended that, whenever possible, appropriate publication of specific advisor's activities and contributions be made.
 - Authorized the Leadership Development Committee to conduct a seminar in the summer of 1978 aimed at chapter presidents and sectional staffs, for the purpose of officer development.
 - Recommended to the 1978 National Convention Committee that a Leadership Development Seminar session be offered at the Convention.
 - Authorized a campaign to raise funds for the purchase of a Fraternity headquarters.
 - Adopted a policy that all monies received in Life Membership fees be deposited as funds for the Endowment Fund.
 - Dedicated the Fall 1978 Pledge Class to Dean Lewis N. Jones of Texas Tech University, former National Board member.
 - Authorized action to commemorate the 5th anniversary of the death of Aubrey B. Hamilton, former Alpha Phi Omega National President.
 - Banned smoking from all official Board meetings.
 - Adopted the following statement of policy: "Consistent with our By-Laws, we emphasize and reaffirm that this Fraternity will not tolerate any physically or mentally abusive or degrading treatment of the active members or pledges of Alpha Phi Omega or any other person."
 - Received a report from the Title IX Exemption Committee which outlined Committee actions since the last Board Meeting, and reported the need for additional donations for the Exemption effort, since expenditures have exceeded donations.
 - Received reports on the progress of the Long Range Planning Commission and its Subcommittees.
 - Received a report that the Endowment Trust Agreement had been executed, an Endowment Custodial Account set up, and a conditional tax exemption for the Endowment Trust received.
 - Received reports requiring no action from the Finance Committee, Alumni Committee, Service Committee, Regional Realignment Committee, Publications Committee, Awards Committee and Salary Administration Committee.
- The next meeting of the National Board of Directors will be July 7-9, 1978, at the Opryland Hotel in Nashville, Tennessee, site of the 1978 National Convention.

XI PSI — WESTERN KENTUCKY UNIVERSITY

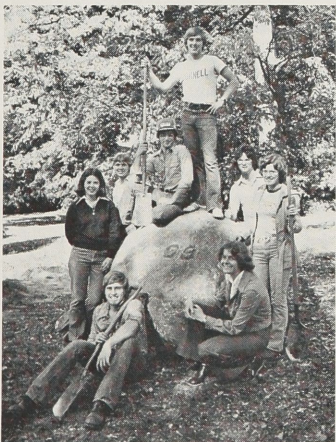

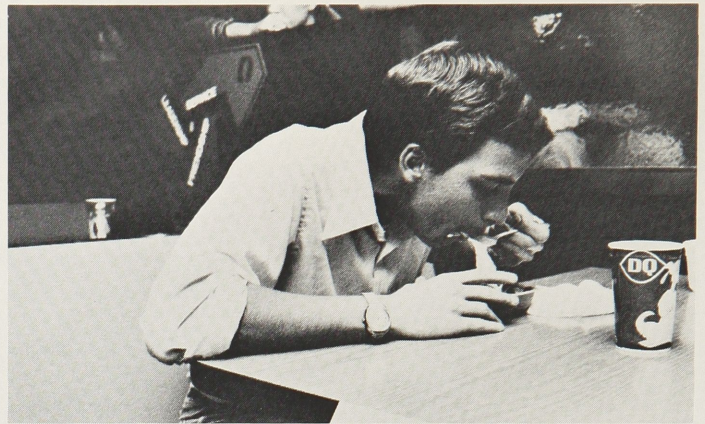

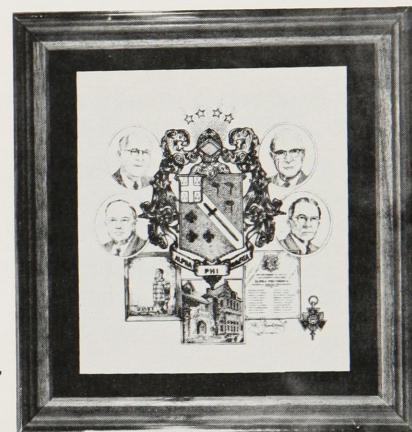
