



Have you seen them lately? Are you taking care of them? Do you have the required number of these Chapter volunteers? The responsibility is yours to assure the strength of this vital asset to your Chapter.


From the Editor.....

Chapters are out for Blood!

It is an old line, but it still works. For many Alpha Phi Omega Chapters the annual blood drive on campus provides them recognition and credibility. The blood drive is one of our oldest service projects. In 1988 the Fraternity was recognized nationally when it was awarded the American Association of Blood Bank's Presidential Award. Today, a number of our Chapters continue to keep this worthwhile project in the forefront of their service. One Chapter conducting an annual blood drive is Gamma Lambda at Clemson University. Recently was awarded the Anderson-based AnMed Regional Blood Center's "Recruiter of the Year" award for sponsoring Clemson's participation in a blood drive contest with the University of South Carolina. Over 2,500 units of blood were donated.

"Normally, the 'Recruiter of the Year' award is given to an individual, but consistently, year after year, APO at Clemson does such a tremendous job of recruiting blood donors that we felt the award really belonged to them as a group," said Barbara Cartwright, AnMed's supervisor of donor resources.

We talk about the impact of our service throughout the school year. National Service Day may be a microcosm of what we really accomplish. On November 4, 1996, our Chapters figuratively joined together in projects that included campus cleanups, park cleanups, planting seedlings, adopt-a-highway, beach cleanups, recycling, and leaf raking just to name a few. A conservative estimate of hours worked is 11,200. If you multiply that by the minimum wage of \$4.45, that is providing almost \$50,000 of service work in one day!

Where do we go from here?

An often quoted adage, variously phrased, says that unless you know where you're going you'll never get there.

To ensure that the Fraternity always knows where it's going, the National Board of Directors and the National Convention have developed and implemented, over the past 10 years or so, a long-range planning process.

The process itself is pretty simple and follows a two-year cycle that moves from one National Convention to the next.

Here's how it works:

The Long-Range Planning
Reference Committee at each National
Convention reviews a set of longrange goals presented by the National
Board and recommends ways to
improve the goals.

Shortly after the Convention, the Board uses those recommendations to revise the goals as necessary to keep them up-to-date and valid, and a specific Board Member is assigned primary responsibility for making sure that progress is made toward accomplishing each goal.

Then, at the next Convention, the Board presents a progress report to that Convention's Long-Range Planning Reference Committee and the process starts all over again.

Although the planning process follows a two-year cycle, fulfilling many of our current long-range goals will take a lot longer than two years. For example, one of our long-range goals is to have at least 450 active Chapters by August of the year 2000.

We also have a goal of building the Alpha Phi Omega Endowment Fund to at least \$3 million by December of the year 2004.

Of course, when you stop to think about it, the year 2000 is right around the corner, and 2004 is only a block

beyond that. So, when you consider that we have about 325 active Chapters at the moment and that the endowment currently stands at about \$1 million, you can see that we definitely have charted a challenging course for ourselves for the next few years.

Meanwhile, some of our other long-range goals are supposed to be completed this year. You're looking at one of them right now: the new and improved T&T.

Because of the leadership, creativity, and persistence of dedicated Brothers such as Kay Krenek, Dave Emery, and Patrick Burke, the T&T has been redesigned to be a more readable, informative and entertaining publication.

This did not happen by accident—it's been one of the Fraternity's long-range goals for several years, and it's one of the goals that the Long-Range Planning Reference Committee at this year's National Convention will be able to check off as completed.

"Is Sustaining Membership for me?"

Sustaining Membership was created in December 1994 for the purpose of getting more alumni involved in Alpha Phi Omega. Think of it like a university's ex-students' association, which is to keep in touch with alumni.

The Sustaining Membership (SM) program is different from Life Membership (LM). LM is a requires one-time fee while SM has a revolving fee. Life Members receive a lifetime subscription to the T&T. Sustaining Members receive the Alumni Light newsletter. Alumni Light is mailed for free for one year to recent graduates. This provides

recent graduates with a way of staying in touch with the Fraternity and encourages alumni to keep the National Office informed of their current address. Other new items are corporate associations and the Career Connection. For more details contact the National Office.

Brothers may become both Life Members and Sustaining Members, (or neither). One does not preclude the other.

Our hope is that Alumni will want to join both, and that in 5-10 years, the SM program will be strong enough to where we have:

- increased our recognized local Alumni Associations,
- helped undergrads choose a profession through the Career Connection
- helped alumni through the Alumni Light to keep up with people they knew in their respective Chapters and met at conventions.
