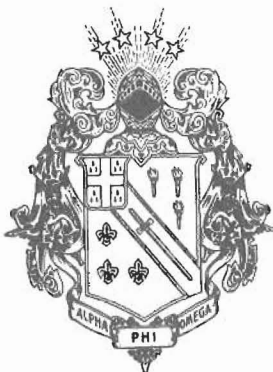

National Service Day Revisited

Alpha Phi Omega Chapters have supported the efforts of the American Red Cross since the earliest days of the Fraternity. The very nature of the Red Cross is an encouragement for our Chapters to become involved.

November 2, 1996, was no exception. It was National Service Day and Nu Delta Chapter at Lebanon Valley College, Annville, Pennsylvania, participated in the "mock" disaster. The student union was used as a "mock" disaster shelter. Various work stations were set up and staffed by Red Cross

volunteers and Chapter members.

Visitors to the event were able to see how the Red Cross and community would deal with a disaster should one occur. It was a good National Service Day project for Nu Delta.

In 1997, Alpha Phi Omega will take a new approach to a past tradition. National Service Day becomes National Service Week (the first full week of November.) Our theme for National Service week this year will be concerned with Hunger and Homelessness.

Be a Leader. Be a Friend. Be of Service.

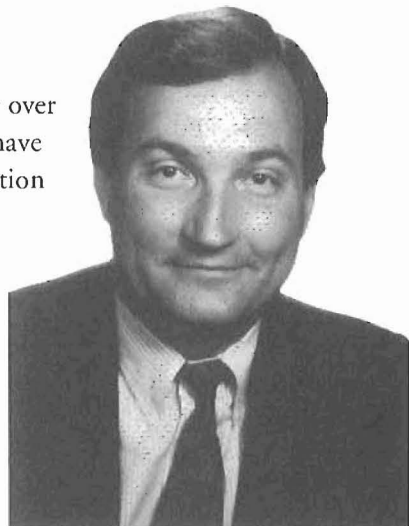
These are the cardinal principles that Alpha Phi Omega has been built upon for over seventy-two years. These ideals are what have made the Fraternity the dynamic organization it is on over 300 college and university campuses around the United States. But how does this dynamic organization continue to meet the needs of its members – by being adaptable.

One of the ways that our Chapters develop this adaptability is through interaction. If you have ever been at a Sectional or Regional Conference or a National Convention, you know of the interchapter communication that occurs. Whether it be at the seminars that are conducted, the social events that ensue, or the service projects you may be asked to participate in, members are placed next to members and, of course, ideas are exchanged.

The National Fraternity also provides opportunities that are specific to the exchange of ideas. It may be the Leadership Series of chapter officer guides or one of the other periodicals that are published which outline thoughts on specific functions. Another way which provides more concentrated ideas and allows for a greater exchange of ideas, is our leadership seminars such as the Leadership Development Workshop (LDW), the Sectional Resource Workshop (SRW), the Leadership Advancement Program (LeAP) and the Chapter Program Workshop (CPW).

This summer members have the opportunity to participate in any one of the CPWs which are being conducted around the country. These weekend retreats give participants time to learn leadership skills from facilitators who bring knowledge and experience to the workshop. It also gives the participants the opportunity to share their own experiences in situations, whether with problem solving, finding new projects, or even new recruiting ideas. I recall the first CPW I attended in 1979. Not only did I leave with ideas I still use today, I left with a resource base of friends who could be called upon to assist in addressing chapter needs.

How does the Fraternity remain the dynamic organization it is — by taking new ideas and strategies and utilizing them in our Chapters. You have this opportunity by attending one of these CPWs and bringing back new ideas to share. Let us always remember our cardinal principles and keep Alpha Phi Omega on the forefront as the example for others to follow.

Yes, APO does have a web site. We have been "visible" for several years thanks to FUZZ's APHIO pages. This spring the APO Home page was made official. You can read us at:

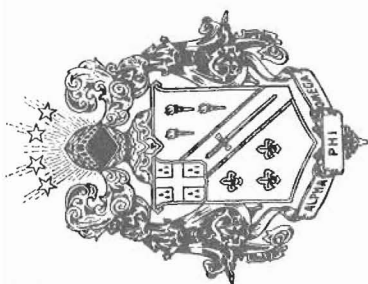

ALPHA ALPHA ZETA

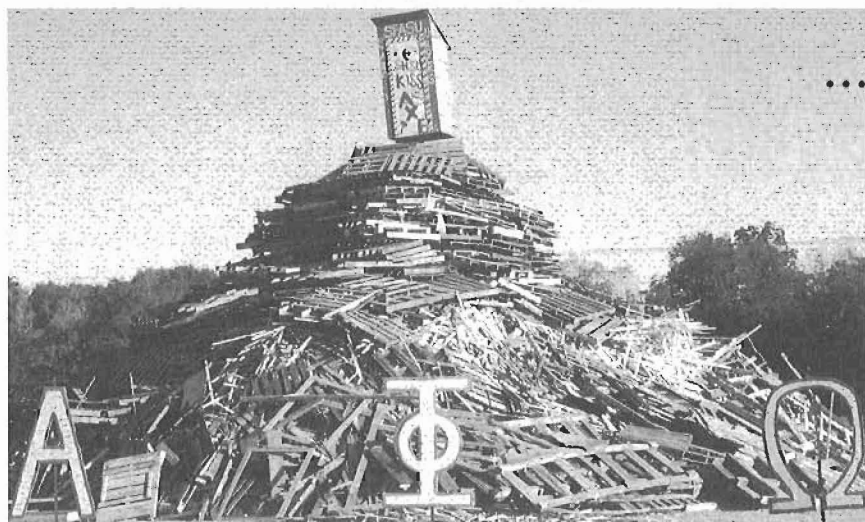
St. Mary's University, San Antonio, Texas

A PLEDGE AGAIN, AFTER 50 YEARS

It all started last spring at a meeting of the Kappa Sigma Advisory Committee at Cal State University in Sacramento, CA. When I mentioned that the 1996 fall semester would mark the Golden Anniversary of my joining APO, one of the other advisors suggested, half in jest, "Why don't you go through the Pledge Class all over again." After thinking it over, I decided to do it.

I thought it would be fun to be a Pledge again, for several reasons: First, to see if I could make it (after all, I am old enough to be their grandfather); to get a fresh outlook on APO, from a Pledge's point of view (as alumni and advisors we sometimes forget what it

was like when we first joined the Fraternity); to find out how things have changed since 1946; and to share my memories of "APO fifty years ago" with the Chapter and Pledge Class. I have worked with young people my whole life, spent 46 years in public education, been active in the BSA for 58 years, and served as Chapter Advisor since 1983.

The only objection to my plan came from my wife: "You want to do WHAT?" We finally agreed that it would be okay, rationalizing that "after all, it's only for eight weeks." (Translation: 9 Pledge Class meetings, 4 Chapter meetings, 2 committee meetings, 7 weekly quizzes, 15 hours of service, 9 interviews, 9 member signatures, 4 advisor signatures, 1 inter-chapter activity, 1 Pledge service project, and passing a written final exam.)

After getting the approval of the Advisory Committee, Executive Committee, and Chapter members, I attended one of the Chapter information meetings, and on September 21, I was formally initiated as a member of the 1996 Pledge Class of Kappa Sigma Chapter.

Some observations on my recycled Pledge experience: The Pledge class was a wonderful group of young people; the Pledge Master was the key

to providing a positive pledge program; the Pledge requirements were a real challenge – some of the class dropped out; the class officers did a great job of planning, organizing, and operating our own program; the National Service Day project with Iota Phi Chapter was a valuable event and chance to meet other Pledges and actives; the weekly quizzes were tough

- too much memorization and not enough comprehension; eight weeks is long enough (the Kappa Sigma program met all of the National Pledging Standards).

In looking back over my Golden Anniversary Pledge Class, I know that I have profited immensely from the

experience. I found that APO has not changed substantially, and that there are many more similarities than differences between the APO of 1946 and 1996. Fifty years ago, for example, Alpha Phi Omega stood for leadership, friendship, and service; but membership was limited to men who were former Boy Scouts, and chapters held informal initiations. Today, Alpha Phi Omega still stands for leadership, friendship, and service; membership is open to all students; and our impressive rituals, sound membership policies, and a pledge program designed to instill a commitment to serving others still stand; informal initiations are a relic of days gone by.

In addition, I was reminded that "the ultimate aim of every pledging period is to teach the worth of human dignity, promote academic scholarship, instill a commitment to continuing service, provide opportunities to participate in leadership development experiences, and cultivate friendship among the pledges and with active members." I don't recall specifically whether my H. Roe Bartle Class of 1946 did all that, but my Thomas H. Kean Class of 1996 certainly did.

On December 7, 1996, I was formally initiated into Kappa Sigma Chapter at California State University, Sacramento, 50 years and 20 days after joining Alpha Delta Chapter at San Diego State College. It was a proud and memorable moment for me.

Maybe more adult advisors and alumni should do what I did (and as National Vice President Jack McKenzie did – I learned about Jack in my Pledge Manual) every 20 or 30 or 50 years, just to keep in touch with the times. And with our future, our Pledges.

Minutes of the Board Meeting

Action taken at the Winter Board Meeting February 8, 1997, in Kansas City, Missouri

- Confirmed the request of the Region II Director to remove Eta Sigma Chapter, University of Delaware, Newark, Delaware, from administrative review.
- Removed the recognition of the Petitioning Group at Virginia Wesleyan College, Norfolk, Virginia.
- Approved a new long-range goal to work with Alpha Phi Omega of the Philippines as part of the International Council of Alpha Phi Omega (ICAPO) to establish two additional National Alpha Phi Omega Organizations and two Associate Members of ICAPO by 2005.
- Elected the following as Trustees to the Alpha Phi Omega Endowment Trust: Lorin Jurvis, 1996-1998; John C. Jadel, 1996-2000; and Dr. Stan Carpenter, 1996-2002.
- Appointed Ron Sklamm, alumnus of Epsilon Mu Chapter, as the 1998 National Convention Coordinator.
- Directed the National Executive Director to negotiate contracts for the 1998 National Convention with the Hyatt Regency and Regal Hotels in Minneapolis, Minnesota, and other hotels in downtown Minneapolis to provide additional sleeping rooms and other appropriate facilities.
- Approved the recharter of Gamma Sigma Chapter at the University of Chicago, Chicago, Illinois, and the Charter of Alpha Delta Sigma

Chapter at Lindenwood College, St. Charles, Missouri.

- Approved a new long-range goal to develop the education materials and internal mechanisms necessary to promote continued alumni interest in the Fraternity's ideals and programs. This program is to be implemented by December 1999, so that all active members can receive information on continuing their support of Alpha Phi Omega upon graduation.
- Approved National Certificates of Appreciation to be presented to Mrs. Jackie Burke for her volunteer service at our National Conventions, and to Brother Sonny "Papits" Fernandez for his efforts in starting Alpha Phi Omega of Canada.
- Approved the summer 1997 Board meeting to be in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, July 18, 1997; the winter 1998 Board Meeting to be in Minneapolis, Minnesota, February 7, 1998; and the summer 1998 Board meeting to be in Denver, Colorado, July 11, 1998.
- The National President—
 - Assigned responsibility for each of the 12 Long Range Goals to members of the Board.
 - Appointed the 1997 Fall Pledge Class Namesake Nominating Committee.
 - Appointed a committee to review concerns and problems encountered by the 1996 National Convention Credentials and Rules Committee and to create a set of procedures and necessary items for

registration, certification and orientation of National Convention Voting Delegates. To be submitted to the Board of Directors for action at the summer 1997 Board Meeting.

- Appointed a committee to review the impact of the proposed "Toast Song" amendments and current exclusionary wording in the rituals and rites of Alpha Phi Omega, with particular attention paid to membership issues. Findings and recommendations should be made available to chapters prior to the start of the next convention.
- Appointed a committee to weigh the costs and benefits of allowing all-male chapters at co-ed institutions to remain all-male and, based on the committee findings, submit relevant legislation to the 1998 National Convention. Interim report due February 1998. Summary report to be published in the Winter 1998 Torch & Trefoil.
