MESSAGE FROM THE NATIONAL PRESIDENT

During the past several years, Alpha Phi Omega has made great strides.

We have senior administrators from several universities active on our National Advisory Committee. We have developed excellent working relationships with other service organizations such as the Campus Opportunity Outreach League. We have built a new national headquarters and are well on our way to paying off its mortgage. We have many national efforts to support chapter programs.

But the cornerstone of our Fraternity continues to be the service programs conducted from college campuses across the nation by our individual chapters. And it is members that make those programs possible.

Without recruitment of new members, every single chapter, every service program, would soon disappear as existing students graduate.

Viewed from the opposite angle, imagine how much more we could do if each of us not only replaced ourselves before graduation, but added an additional member. Imagine if we had chapters at 450 colleges and universities instead of 312.

To be ultimately successful, Alpha Phi Omega must continue to grow. It must be inviting and attractive to every student who shares our ideals and our commitment to service. There must be no barriers impeding those who wish to serve.

Exclusivity has no place in a Service Fraternity, whether it stems directly from conscious decisions or in-

directly from practices or traditions that undercut the identities of prospective members.

Strength and unity flow from diversity.

Our membership programs must ensure through objective standards that new members share our ideals of leadership, friendship and service. But our system must also be dynamic and open. People who genuinely wish to join us at our table must feel welcome in our embrace. The arms of a true friend must always be waiting.

When your fundamental purpose is service to others, bigger is better.

Bigness diminishes friendship and unity of purpose only if we let it by ignoring the challenge.

I have never met a person with too many friends. I have never seen a service program that could not use another pair of hands. And I have never worked with leaders so gifted that additional assistance was not needed.

One of our founders, in a letter to the 1992 National Convention, said: "Never did [the original fourteen founders] imagine that the growth of

New-member education program

... 1992 convention approves alternative

Responding to the needs of chapters at schools where pledging has been banned, the National Convention in December adopted an alternative new-member education program for use on such campuses.

The decision followed an 18month study of the issue by the National Board of Directors. The study found that hazing concerns had prompted several colleges and universities, as well as national fraternities and sororities, to restrict or eliminate pledging programs.

The study concluded that Alpha Phi Omega needed to develop an alternative to pledging for use by chapters facing such restrictions.

The Convention authorized an alternative program for use only after a school's administration, by written notice to the National Office, has prohibited the Fraternity from conducting a pledge program on that campus.

Within the limits of the alternative program approved by the Convention, the chapter and its Regional Director would work out the details of a specific plan acceptable to the local administration.

The general program includes a "rush" phase, an education phase and a pre-active phase:

"Rush" phase

- · "Rush" would involve a service project and a fellowship activity, in addition to the traditional "open meeting."
- · Participation in these eyents would be mandatory for prospective members; therefore, to provide ample opportunity for participation, more than one of each type of event might have to be held.
- · The "rush" period would last 2-3 weeks, followed by a meeting at which key chapter officers would explain how the chapter operates and would answer any questions the prospective members might have. At that meeting, each prospective member still interested would be given a "pledge manual" and other relevant materials, assigned a "Big Brother" mentor, and told the date, time and cost of initiation, which comes after the education phase.

Education phase

- · There would be 2-4 meetings to educate the prospective members about the chapter's programs, activities and structure.
- Each prospective member would be expected to become involved in at least one project/committee/etc. (depending on the chapter's structure).
- · Prospective members would be encouraged to get to know each other as well as active Brothers; however, no formal requirements such as "interviews" would be allowed.

· The education phase would end with initiation of the new members, who would become Brothers of Alpha Phi Omega once their applications and fees arrive in the National Office. This would be a permanent membership that could not be taken away except as provided by the National Bylaws; however, these new Brothers would not have immediate active status in the local chapter nor the right to vote.

Pre-Active phase

· To gain active status in the local chapter, each new member would have to participate in a minimum number of service projects, chapter meetings, and other such events. The specific requirements would be set by the chapter and would have to be objective.

· Participation in activities before initiation would count toward meeting the requirements, but they would be set up so that they could not be completely met until several weeks after initiation. This would give the new members time and incentive to learn more about the chapter before gaining the right to vote.

· The requirements for becoming active, however, would have to be consistent with the requirements applicable to all Brothers for maintaining active status. Otherwise, "pledging" simply has been delayed until after initiation.

COMMITTEE APPOINTMENT

National President Jerry Schroeder has appointed Dr. Gerard J. Kennedy as Chair of the National Scouting Relations Committee. Dr. Kennedy has been an Executive Board member of the National Capital Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America since 1965 and is a former Dean of Students at The Catholic University of America. He was the founding president of Nu Psi Chapter and has served as chair of the APO advisory committee at Montclair State College and the University of Connecticut. He is a past Region I Director and National Board member of the Fraternity.

Planning for next semester's recruitment of new brothers should begin now.


Chapters in Action

MU GAMMA

SECTION 52

On the weekend of October 11-13, 1991, the Brothers of five chapters in Section 52 gathered on the campus of Ball State University in Muncie, Indiana, to volunteer their time and share in a grand expression of love. It was an experience none of them would forget. Part of the AIDS Quilt, a memorial to thousands who have died, was displayed in Irving Gymnasium at Ball State. The Quilt was brought to Ball State by a host committee representing several student organizations. This committee also included Delta Xi Brother and Section 52 Service Chair Bill Warnock. On the first night of the display, Brothers from Delta Xi (Ball State), Tau Lambda (Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology), Zeta Gamma (Valparaiso University), Alpha Gamma (Purdue University), and Tau Omicron (IUPUI) joined with other student organizations in a candlelight vigil to commemorate those who have died of AIDS. The brothers then viewed the Quilt for the first time.

Following the first viewing, brothers gathered at the Delta Xi chapter office to watch Common Threads, a documentary on the Quilt. Afterward, a panel was constructed for addition to the Quilt on behalf of Alpha Phi Omega. The next day, brothers gathered early to do their volunteer work. They worked as door monitors, Quilt monitors, information booth staffers, merchandise salespersons, and security personnel. Everyone was assigned duties in rotating three-hour blocks. Several also volunteered to read names. Background information on the Quilt and training for each assignment was given to everyone. Over 7,000 people came to view the AIDS Quilt. In addition, \$5,000 was raised through merchandise sales to help finance the NAMES project. THETA CHI

On October 11, 1992, members of the Theta Chi chapter at the George Washington University, Washington, D.C., volunteered to serve at the Aids Quilt display. The brothers attended volunteer meetings in conjunction with the NAMES project, Washington, D.C. Brothers served as guardians of the Quilt and at information booths. They were part of 4,000 volunteers from 19 countries. The Quilt displayed in its entirety had 21,000-plus panels and covered the grounds near the Washington Monument. OMICRON

Last September members of the Omicron chapter at the University of Iowa, Iowa City, assisted the Red Cross of Iowa City. The chapter collected donations for the Disaster Relief Fund. During the Iowa Hawkeye and Miami Hurricane football game in Iowa City, over \$4,000 in contributions was raised to aid victims of Hurricane Andrew. Later in October members donned their warmest winter gear for protection from the elements while taking part in the fourth annual Rock-a-Thon. Members rocked in rocking chairs for a 24-hour period after collecting donations for the Emergency Housing Project in Iowa City. Approximately \$240 was raised for this project. The fall '92 pledge class of Omicron launched their dedication to service on Saturday, November 7. Pledges and invited actives held a supply drive for the benefit of the Emergency Housing Project in Iowa City. The success of the collection was evident in two heaping carloads of badly needed paper and cleaning products. The chapter also held a bake sale in which funds were donated to the Kirkwood Fund which allows people to earn their high school diploma.
